Your objectives should appear in the introduction of your research paper, at the end of your problem statement.
3. **Data Analysis:** Data analysis is the most crucial part of any research. Data analysis summarizes collected data. It involves the interpretation of data gathered through the use of analytical and logical reasoning to determine patterns, relationships or trends. You can present through using graph and diagrams.
4. **Conclusion and Suggestions:** The conclusion is intended to help the reader understand why your research should matter to them after they have finished reading the paper. A conclusion is not merely a summary of your points or a re-statement of your research problem but a synthesis of key points.
5. **Reference in research project:** A reference is a detailed description of the source of information that you want to give credit to via a citation. The references in research project are usually in the form of a list at the end of the project.
